Psalm

Psalm 81 (New English Bible version)

Sing out in praise of God our refuge, acclaim the God of Jacob.

Take pipe and tabor, take tuneful harp and lute.

Blow the horn for the new month, for the full moon on the day of our pilgrim-feast. This is a law for Israel, an ordinance of the God of Jacob, laid as a solemn charge on Joseph when he came out of Egypt.

When I lifted the load from his shoulders, his hands let go the builder's basket. When you cried to me in distress, I rescued you; unseen, I answered you in thunder. I tested you at the waters of Meribah, where I opened your mouths and filled them. I fed Israel with the finest wheat-flour and satisfied him with honey from the rocks. Listen, my people, while I give you a solemn charge –do but listen to me, O Israel: you shall have no strange god nor bow down to any foreign god;

I am the LORD your God who brought you up from Egypt.

But my people did not listen to my words and Israel would have none of me; so I sent them off, stubborn as they were,

to follow their own devices.

If my people would but listen to me, if Israel would only conform to my ways, I would soon bring their enemies to their knees and lay a heavy hand upon their persecutors.

Let those who hate them come cringing to them, and meet with everlasting troubles.

Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit; as it was in the beginning is now and shall be for ever. Amen

Scripture Reading John 20:19-31 read by Jennifer Pickering

¹⁹ On the evening of that first day of the week, when the disciples were together, with the doors locked for fear of the Jewish leaders, Jesus came and stood among them and said, 'Peace be with you!' ²⁰ After he said this, he showed them his hands and side. The disciples were overjoyed when they saw the Lord.

²¹ Again Jesus said, 'Peace be with you! As the Father has sent me, I am sending you.' ²² And with that he breathed on them and said, 'Receive the Holy Spirit. ²³ If you forgive anyone's sins, their sins are forgiven; if you do not forgive them, they are not forgiven.'

²⁴ Now Thomas (also known as Didymus^[2]), one of the Twelve, was not with the disciples when Jesus came. ²⁵ So the other disciples told him, 'We have seen the Lord!'

But he said to them, 'Unless I see the nail marks in his hands and put my finger where the nails were, and put my hand into his side, I will not believe.'

²⁶ A week later his disciples were in the house again, and Thomas was with them. Though the doors were locked, Jesus came and stood among them and said, 'Peace be with you!' ²⁷ Then he said to Thomas, 'Put your finger here; see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it into my side. Stop doubting and believe.'

²⁸Thomas said to him, 'My Lord and my God!'

²⁹ Then Jesus told him, 'Because you have seen me, you have believed; blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed.'

³⁰ Jesus performed many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not recorded in this book. ³¹ But these are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name.

Going Deeper

Bible Notes

'Peace be with you' is an exhortation shared on several occasions throughout the Gospels, usually when there is great news about to be shared. This is not the quiet peace of the status quo, of life as normal; this is the disruptive yet reassuring peace that comes because Jesus is risen from the dead. It is the beginning of something new.

This also comes near the end of the Gospel where John shares the reasoning behind writing his account. The arc of this narrative then reaches from the first century right out to us: 'These are written so that you may come to believe...and that through believing you may have life in his name.' The purpose of this story pushes ever outwards, bringing life to the world through our response.

Thomas was unable to take someone's word for the resurrection but needed to touch and interact with Jesus in order to believe and declare, 'My Lord and my God!' In embracing Christ for themselves, the disciples were then able to go and share that invitation with others. We are invited to receive the embrace of Jesus for ourselves: what are we doing to help others receive and respond to that same invitation?



Questions for reflection

- How would you feel about sharing this moment with someone?
- What practical difference does it make having accepted Jesus into your life?
- What experiences make you feel most 'at peace'?

A personal prayer Let me feel the touch of peace and life, the touch of the risen Lord, beside me, behind me, and before me all the days of my life. Amen.
