others above yourselves, ⁴ not looking to your own interests but each of you to the interests of the others.

⁵ In your relationships with one another, have the same mindset as Christ Jesus:

⁶ Who, being in very nature^{III} God, did not consider equality with God something to be used to his own advantage; ⁷ rather, he made himself nothing by taking the very nature^{III} of a servant, being made in human likeness. ⁸ And being found in appearance as a man, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to death - even death on a cross!

⁹ Therefore God exalted him to the highest place and gave him the name that is above every name, ¹⁰ that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth,¹¹ and every tongue acknowledge that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father. ¹² Therefore, my dear friends, as you have always obeyed—not only in my presence, but now much more in my absence—continue to work out your salvation with fear and trembling, ¹³ for it is God who works in you to will and to act in order to fulfill his good purpose.

Going Deeper

This week's reading: Philippians 2.1-13

Bible Notes

Philippi, originally a Greek city, was considered to be a miniature Rome. The Romans knew how to run the empire and keep people in order. Slavery was taken for granted and woven throughout Roman society. Jesus' death by crucifixion was the ultimate slave's death; by asking the people of Philippi to be like Christ, Paul is asking them to embrace this existence, the lowest in the Roman Empire.

We can assume that people in Philippi would have heard of the crucifixion story, which must have been brought in via trade routes. Status was everything in their world, but this story and Paul's message about it shows that this kind of status doesn't mean anything to God.

In a world obsessed with self-interest and self-image, putting aside your own interests for the interests of others is quite a challenge, and one that we, as followers of Jesus, need to wrestle with. What does this look like in practice? How can we balance this with the need for self-care?

Questions for Reflection



- Where do you see yourself in this image?
- When do you find joy in helping others?
- If the keyhole represents key support, what does that look like in your community?

Live your faith

Think of someone you don't normally engage with – or someone who represents a group or ideology that that you dislike – and do something specific and positive for that person.

A random act of kindness
