Second Reading: Jonah 4 read by Richard Beckingsale

- 1 But to Jonah this seemed very wrong, and he became angry. 2 He prayed to the Lord, 'Isn't this what I said, Lord, when I was still at home? That is what I tried to forestall by fleeing to Tarshish. I knew that you are a gracious and compassionate God, slow to anger and abounding in love, a God who relents from sending calamity. 3 Now, Lord, take away my life, for it is better for me to die than to live.'
- **4** But the Lord replied, 'Is it right for you to be angry?'

5 Jonah had gone out and sat down at a place east of the city. There he made himself a shelter, sat in its shade and waited to see what would happen to the city. **6** Then the Lord God provided a leafy plant and made it grow up over Jonah to give shade for his head to ease his discomfort, and Jonah was very happy about the plant. **7** But at dawn the next day God provided a worm, which chewed the plant so that it withered. **8** When the sun rose, God provided a scorching east wind, and the sun blazed on Jonah's head so

that he grew faint. He wanted to die, and said, 'It would be better for me to die than to live.'

9 But God said to Jonah, 'Is it right for you to be angry about the plant?'

'It is,' he said. 'And I'm so angry I wish I were dead.'

10 But the Lord said, 'You have been concerned about this plant, though you did not tend it or make it grow. It sprang up overnight and died overnight. **11** And should I not have concern for the great city of Nineveh, in which there are more than a hundred and twenty thousand people who cannot tell their right hand from their left – and also many animals?'

Going Deeper



Bible Notes

This book makes Jonah out to be a parody of what a real prophet should be. Everyone knows the delightful tale of Jonah being swallowed by the 'great fish'. The irony is that, whilst the heathen sailors do all they can to placate the gods, Jonah is asleep, so far as God is concerned. The Assyrians are the old enemy and Jonah's excuse is that as foreigners they cannot be part of God's plan. But God's servants are called as 'a light to the nations' (Isaiah 49.5-6), and now Jonah is called 'a second time'. The people of Nineveh, the godless heathen as Jonah sees them, respond immediately to his preaching. And God did change his mind, much to the annoyance of Jonah, as the story goes on to relate. Jonah should have known better, but instead responds by sulking when God forgives. He could be the prototype for the elder brother in the story of the prodigal son (Luke. 15.25-32).

Living Faith

Look through the newspaper and reflect on the people and places that are in the same situation as Nineveh: in need of change, waiting for a prophet, longing for someone to call them anew. How can we be Jonah in the world, offering the chance of renewal and redemption?




Today's Bible reading

Jonah 3.1-5,10


The story of Jonah who ends up inside a whale is a funny one. It reminds us that God can change his mind and we can turn to him.






Activity 1
