Summary of the law

On the third day a wedding took place at Cana in Galilee. Jesus' mother was there, **2** and Jesus and his disciples had also been invited to the wedding. **3** When the wine was gone, Jesus' mother said to him, 'They have no more wine.'

4 'Woman, why do you involve me?' Jesus replied. 'My hour has not yet come.'

5 His mother said to the servants, 'Do whatever he tells you.'

6 Nearby stood six stone water jars, the kind used by the Jews for ceremonial washing, each holding from eighty to a hundred and twenty litres. 7 Jesus said to the servants, 'Fill the jars with water'; so they filled them to the brim. 8 Then he told them, 'Now draw some out and take it to the master of the banquet.' They did so, 9 and the master of the banquet tasted the water that had been turned into wine. He did not realise where it had come from, though the servants who had drawn the water knew. Then he called the bridegroom aside 10 and said, 'Everyone brings out the choice wine first and then the cheaper wine after the guests have had too much to drink; but you have saved the best till now.'

11 What Jesus did here in Cana of Galilee was the first of the signs through which he revealed his glory; and his disciples believed in him.

Going Deeper

24th January 2021

This week's reading: John 2.1-11

Bible Notes

This passage introduces us to the 'signs' of John's Gospel: seven are particularly highlighted throughout the Gospel. They are revelations of God's kingdom. In a sense they are acted parables that teach about God, and this is particularly true of this first sign.

There were in fact very few people who would have been aware of what had happened, but in this Gospel, it stands as the first action in Jesus' ministry, and so, for our benefit, is given much significance. Matthew and Luke both contain an actual parable based on a wedding, and the setting at this actual wedding also points to the banquet at the end of the age. This is a sign about the coming of God's kingdom both here and now, and in the future. This is further emphasised by Jesus' reply to his mother's intervention, that 'my hour has not yet come'. 'Hour' is a key word used through the Gospel to represent the coming of God's kingdom, often with specific reference to Jesus' coming death and resurrection.

At this point, the nature of the miracle becomes significant. It is the water used by the Jews for ceremonial washing that is turned into wine. This water was kept in large stone jars because these would be the cleanest vessels. This provides a clear contrast between the old order and the new order that Jesus ushers in. God is doing something new in Jesus. The amount of wine now available seems much more than can be drunk and this wine is the best; both factors that point to the generosity of the miracle and so to the generosity of God. The reasons for the lack of wine are not discussed, although it is likely that all those who came shared in the responsibility of providing for the wedding. We normally read the text from a position of plenty, but if read from a situation of scarcity, perhaps a reason for running out of wine, then the generosity of the provision is further emphasised.

A reflective prayer

It's so easy for us, O God, to think wearily that the wine has run out, that the good things have gone, and that nothing more is to be done. We forget even to turn to you with the problems that face us, but resign ourselves to what seems inevitable.

Like Mary at Cana, help us in quiet trust to bring our concerns, unsure though we may be how you will address them.

Convinced of your longing to celebrate with us the life you offer, in all its fullness.

May we be ready to receive your rich blessings and to rejoice.

We ask it in the name of Jesus, our teacher and friend.

Today's Bible reading


John 2.1-11
