Share the Word John 2.13-22 (video)

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13 When it was almost time for the Jewish Passover, Jesus went up to Jerusalem. 14 In the temple courts he found people selling cattle, sheep and doves, and others sitting at

tables exchanging money. 15 So he made a whip out of cords, and drove all from the temple courts, both sheep and cattle; he scattered the coins of the money-changers and overturned their tables. 16 To those who sold doves he said, 'Get these out of here! Stop turning my Father's house into a market!' 17 His disciples remembered that it is written: 'Zeal for your house will consume me.'

18 The Jews then responded to him, 'What sign can you show us to prove your authority to do all this?'

19 Jesus answered them, 'Destroy this temple, and I will raise it again in three days.' 20 They replied, 'It has taken forty-six years to build this temple, and you are going to raise it in three days?' 21 But the temple he had spoken of was his body. 22 After he was raised from the dead, his disciples recalled what he had said. Then they believed the Scripture and the words that Jesus had spoken.

Find any dice you might have kicking around in your house, perhaps borrow some from a board game. Take turns rolling the dice and pray like this (you can decide between you if prayers are to be spoken out loud, thought silently, drawn, or a mix!):

- □ Pray for something that you need.
- ☑ Praise God for something that he is.
- Pray for someone in your family.
- ☑ Thank God for something in creation
- I Pray for a need outside of you or your family.

We sometimes end prayers with the word "Amen", which is a Hebrew word from the Bible, meaning something like "so be it" or "that's right!". Why don't you end with a big Amen?

Under construction

John 2.13-22

A dramatic scene of Jesus creating chaos in the Temple by driving out the money changers and animal sellers. The Jewish authorities are not pleased and demand to know who he thinks he is, at which Jesus predicts his death and resurrection in a metaphor about rebuilding the Temple.

Now read John 2.13-22 see p.2 for text.

PLAT

Play a game of Jenga[™], where you have to remove blocks from the tower without it falling down. Each time you remove a block, read the next verse of the Bible passage and come up with a question you have about that verse. If you are playing the game with others, see if anyone can answer your question, or offer their ideas about it. If you are playing on your own, write the questions down and share them with someone from your church, next time you catch up.

At the start of the week, cut up some paper into brick-shaped pieces and clear a board or space on a wall. Towards the end of each day, find a time to reflect on some things you did that day which showed something about God or what it is to be part of the Church – God's spiritual house. If you live with others, you could talk together about the things you're writing down on the brick-shaped paper. Each time, stick your bricks onto your board or wall, and build a structure over the course of the week.

LENT GARDEN OF RESPONSES

This week, choose something to give up – just for the week. It could be meat, or sugar, playing video games, or anything else. During the week, whenever you think about or want that thing, let it remind you that you too are 'under construction' and God is at work in you. Ask God to show you more about what you can be, and what the Church can be, too. Place a reminder of what you gave up in your garden tray or on your garden page (that you've been progressing throughout Lent). Try to place or draw the items so that you make the tray or page begin to look like a sculpture garden.
